

HOW ARE YOU GOING TO DEVISE RULES/INSTRUCTIONS FOR YOUR GAME?

Task:

You need to devise a set of rules/instructions to help others learn how to play your game. Teaching a completely new game to others is not always easy. It is important to remember that your audience has no idea how any aspect of your game works. That's where your set of game rules comes in. Writing game rules can take a bit of time. It's important to include detailed instructions of the objective, all the pieces, and how the game is played.

Success Criteria:

- ✓ You should make sure your rules/instructions have a title.
- ✓ You should make sure your rules/instructions are clear and concise.
- ✓ You should make sure your rules/instructions are step-by-step and easy to understand.
- ✓ You should use sub-headings and numbers for ordering different points.

Things to consider:

Format your rules/instructions:

- Write your rules/instructions to be read aloud.
- Use the second person.
- Make specific terms easy to understand.
- Look at other rules and instructions from games you have in school or at home as a guide.

Create your rules/instructions:

- Explain the concept of the game.
- Write your rules/instructions in order, grouping information together and explaining everything (consider drawing to create a visual aid).

Finalising your rules/instructions:

- Read through your rules/instructions to ensure they make sense and are simple enough to understand.
- Add any strategy tips.

What will the 'Rules and Instructions' look like?

Your rules/instructions may be either hand drawn or made on a computer and printed off to bring in.
