Improvement Priorities

Our 4 key improvement priorities remain the same going into 2023 2024.

Overview of CREW from Alex Priest (DHT)

This is new for S1s. Pupils wanted more welfare support and so CREW will be implemented (crew of a ship – everyone having equal responsibility). This will add to the welfare support we already have. S1s 25 mins every morning – taking account of when they step on the bus to when they step off. Crew of 14 with a leader (staff).

Check in after weekend.

Will do oracy based stuff. Ensuring everyone has to speak, equipment check, etc.

Each week will have a different theme. Relationship builder, community focus week,

This is a pilot, and only for S1s in order to get buy-in. P7 parents told – interest and positivity from them. At the P7 induction day, the P7s were placed in their crew ready for August.

There is no end goal in mind.

Question about S1 PE from last time:

Huge variety of taster sports in S1 PE – basketball, football, Tchuk Ball, volleyball, Shinty, dodgeball, handball, touch rugby, athletics, swimming, orienteering, badminton. Rotation – 3 weeks. Haven't tended to focus on netball but can do this if pupil interest. Netball club (junior and senior) available too.

5. Treasurer's Report

£619.95 in balance. Paid school £700 after last meeting.

6. AOCB

Parentsportal is clunky and off-putting: little that can be done as is a Scotland wide portal.

Driver safety. Any sessions targeted at pupils?

Young Drivers Scheme delivered sessions to S5 and S6 over 2 days. This will run every year Water safety talks will start next week

Mr Foy would prefer pupils not to drive to school.

Toilets – changes made so S1-3S have their own (Science), and S4-6s theirs (Maths). Walker building ones open to everyone. Pilot until summer.
