### 4) Head Teacher's Report

Thanks to Rob and the AAPC members and thanks to everyone who has come along this evening. Your support is much appreciated.

### Start of new session

Getting routines established at start of new year. Supporting new S1 classes and pupils.

Really pleased with how the new S1 settling in. Good feedback from staff. Much better oracy skills than other post covid groups. Our oracy work and CREW continuing to develop this.

Big focus on uniform. I am at the door every morning. Significant increase in families asking/accepting help with uniform which is positive.

Staff – spent inset day looking at the implementation of our new LTA charter. This defines what excellence looks like and how we measure ourselves and consistency across the school. Open Doors this week and last week.

Last year every member of staff completed a practitioner enquiry linked to one of our 4 school priorities. This year we have formed 5 collaborative learning groups – Support, Challenge, CREW, Oracy/PBL and Skills.

Our 4 Improvement Plan priorities can be found on the school website in the info section. Myself and DHT's will give updates throughout the year. Lots of work ongoing with our partners the Wood Foundation, The Fife Arms, Glen Tanar estate and HorseBack UK.

You will have seen recent publicity around Reinforced Autoclave Aerated Concrete (RAAC). No indication of issues in Aboyne Academy.

Potential industrial action (26<sup>th</sup> – 28<sup>th</sup> Sept). Major impact not expected. I will clarify in writing tomorrow.

### <u>This term</u>

House Leadership Teams – organising house weeks, school walk, recycling, litter

Extra-curricular Fair – last wed. List of extra-curricular on website being updated. In Bulletin.

Career Ready – 3 senior students completed internships in the Summer. 5 starting new programme this year.

Staff - JM (Med with distinction).

DoE – over 100 pupils. Developed new model post covid supported by parents/volunteers. Really pleased with how this is developing.

Bobby Seagull and Lucy Shepherd visits to S1 and S2 last week.

S3 parents evening face to face last Tuesday.

Pond project and Talkpod ongoing over next few months.

Classroom furniture – replacement starting with Humanities. Some items that need disposed of currently sitting outside beside Biomass boiler. This will be removed in October. Other furniture will be available for collection/upcycling etc during year.

# SQA Attainment

Initial results look very positive. Significant increase in performance in S4.

### <u>S5</u>

Performance was good but statistics based on S4 roll. This was 142 but by S5 there were only 118 left. Disparity in statistic is those who have left (who all left to positive destinations) not the performance of this year's pupils!

Next steps to analyse attainment with faculties. PT meetings. Lewis Paterson, national attainment advisor coming to see PT's in November. Focus on developing some new NPA qualifications for the SP curriculum.

### Pupil and Family Wellbeing

Finance remains a key thing in our approaches this session. Financial situation challenging for many families. Uniform stays the same for now. We need to work on the swapshop idea. Whole school walk not sponsored.

Balance too – happy to look at increase in possibilities for activities but with support for families.

#### Staffing Update

Dougie Kinnear – returned from secondment to Banchory.

#### **Challenges**

Vaping – huge issues in every school. Range of strategies and HT's working with Public Health Scotland.

Litter – significant increase much linked to canteen food and vaping. Group looking at recycling. Pupil volunteers for litter picking. Would ask for parents support in reinforcing that message please.

Hospitality staffing – some experiences will be provided. Big plan to revitalise this part of the school. Focus of future AAPC meeting.

#### Questions

Progression qualifications: where do they sit? Nat 4/5 level. i.e. sport and recreation as alternative to PE.

Welfare fund: who pays into it? PC money, some generous parents, etc put into it. But how do we make it sustainable? Good to get PC input. Payments of roughly  $\pm 20$  – school jumper, DofE registration etc
