Engineering Science

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	Engineering Science is a practical course where you will investigate the role of engineers in industry, control systems including electrical and electronic circuits and programmable microcontrollers, and mechanical systems including mechanical and pneumatic components.
Subject Description	Pupils will learn how to build circuits, as well as writing programs and simulating mechanical systems. Pupils will also be expected to use the knowledge gained to solve challenging problems which will include the use of mathematical formulae so good numeracy skills are essential .
	Entry Requirements:
	You will have gained skills in S1 and S2 to allow you to take this course. However, you must also have good Maths skills as there is a considerable amount of maths involved in Engineering, and you must also have good ICT skills. An ability to work safely is important too, as there are times when you will be working with equipment that can be dangerous if not used correctly.
