## Practical woodworking

This course is a challenging introduction to the basics of Woodwork, and pupils will cover three units, and also complete a Final Project. The course covers the correct use of tools and equipment and a range of materials, processes & techniques. Learners will be able to read and interpret diagrams, and work safely in a workshop-based setting. They will get to use some creative skills, and plan their activities through to completing a finished product in wood.

Practical Woodworking N4/5	
Requirements	You must have completed either Practical Craft Skills or Design and Manufacture in S3 to take Practical Woodworking at National 4 or 5. If you do not have these subjects from S3, you must seek permission from the Faculty PT.
Assessment	This course does have a 1-hour final written exam, and a challenging Final Project. You must also complete three units in the following areas: Carcase Construction Flat Frame Construction Machining and Finishing Final Project (100% of overall grade at National 5) To pass the course, you must complete each unit to within the tolerances stated below: National 5 $+ or - 1mm$ National 4 $+ or - 2mm$
Progression / Next Steps	This course allows pupils to go onto an apprenticeship or college. This course is not offered above National 5 level, but pupils may decide to study Practical Metalwork as an alternative. This is an excellent course for pupils who wish to pursue a career or further study in: Cabinet Maker, Furniture Designer, Furniture Polisher or Finisher, Glazier, Joiner or Carpenter, Locksmith, Product Designer, Prop Maker, Set Designer, Shopfitter, Stagehand.
